FXW will follow up by offering a meeting as well.

The mandate for schools to publish bullying procedures and policies on publicly accessible websites reinforces our commitment to accountability and accessibility. We recognize that clear communication of policies empowers students, parents, and educators to take an active role in combating bullying and promoting a culture of respect.

Finally, the collection and reporting of non-identifiable data regarding verified allegations of bullying is essential for understanding the prevalence and nature of bullying in our schools.
